COMMUNITY POTENTIALS

Based on the premise that a problem cannot be solved on the level on which it was created, in 2021 – the second year of the pandemic, the National Foundation launched new programmes of cooperation and investment into social development.

The pandemic crisis has confirmed many problems we had been aware of for years, but also disclosed many which were insufficiently visible and have generally shown us that the world needs to embark on jointly finding solutions to those global problems.

The National Foundation gave its contribution to this move towards global solutions through two levels of new programmes in 2021, namely **“Community Potentials”** and **“Do Good with a Heart Print”** (DoGood).

Potential is everything we have and everything that we can awaken in ourselves and in our communities. There are so many ways to reach the destination where every community, no matter how big or small, is the source of individuals with endless talents and possibilities that we should know how to recognise and develop. This is exactly what the National Foundation strives to achieve with the program “Community Potentials”: to turn everything we can and know into new possibilities and potentials of modern Croatia – where success and smiles are two sides of our one common goal. **13** initiatives that we supported during 2021 have confirmed that we have not only potential, but also the knowledge and skills to develop sustainability and resilience of local communities in Croatia.

The “Do Good with Our Heart Print” programme encourages children and youth in primary and secondary schools to recognise UN global sustainable development goals and their application in everyday life. Thus children and young people think, act and live responsibly in accordance with the principles of sustainable development. In 2021, the “Do Good with Our Heart Print” programme on the international platform DoGood featured **11** schools with active engagement of **26** teachers and **372** children and youth from the involved primary and secondary schools.

A major step in 2021 was also made in the National Foundation’s role as Intermediate Body Level 2 for the Operational Programme “Efficient Human Potentials”, of which you can read more in the editorial by the president of the Management Board, Prof. Dražen Vikić-Topić.

In this 2021 Annual Report of the National Foundation for Civil Society Development, through an overview of numerous successes of joined and organised citizens it is evident that many forms of support based on values provide benefit both for local communities and for the society at large.

In addition to the steps mentioned above, it is a pleasure to also see measureable indicators of change and impact that we have achieved by investing into **330** grants that provided for the employment of a total of **750** persons, with a multiplier effect on the improvement of the quality of life of our country’s citizens, increase in the level of social capital, promotion and protection of human rights, environmental protection, sustainable development, different forms of inclusion of excluded groups in the society, building of democratic institutions of the society, development of social entrepreneurship, mitigation of poverty, and renewed recognition of the value of empathy and solidarity among people.

We invite you to get involved in your own way in the positive changes that are going to make it possible to improve socio-economic relations and develop our local communities’ potentials as the foundation of our society’s overall resilience and sustainability, and we are confident that you will find additional inspiration to do so by reading the National Foundation’s 2021 Annual Report.

INVESTMENT INTO CIVIL SOCIETY DEVELOPMENT

Since 2012, the National Foundation for Civil Society Development has been acting as Intermediate Body Level 2 (IB-2) in the system of managing and controlling grants from EU funds for civil society organisations.

The past year of 2021 has demonstrated and proven the value of investing into civil society development through quality and efficient use of resources from the European Social Fund. It was a year in which we reached, until recently unfathomable, over **1 billion kuna** invested into **795** contracted projects for the programming period of 2014-2020 within the Operational Programme "Efficient Human Potentials". This is twice as much as what the National Foundation, through its own programmes of support to organised civil society, has invested in the past 18 years of its activities.

In 2021, a total of **247** projects were contracted through **5** published calls, and owing to the National Foundation's investments into digitalisation of the monitoring of contracted project implementation and the introduction of electronic signature for officers in the departments for EU programmes in the National Foundation, excellent results have been achieved, among which I will highlight but a few:

- A total of **1,116** applications for reimbursement were processed through the special software ZNS_Plus
- **6,010** documents were digitally signed
- **19,427** digital signatures were used for total approvals of funds in the operations of the National Foundation as IB-2
- Through the special digital module of the ESF_Plus software, beneficiaries sent **12,724** queries related to the implementation of contracted projects.

The importance of investments from ESF is best manifested in the financial indicators that suggest that in 2021, as part of the approved applications for reimbursement, a total of **HRK 172,271,317.28** were approved and wages were paid for **2,165** persons through employment contracts, while **1,517** persons were paid a second income.

These exceptional results and achievements demonstrate that the National Foundation as Intermediate Body Level 2 has justified the confidence shown to it by its inclusion in the national structure of managing and controlling the use of ESF grants within the Operational Programme "Efficient Human Potentials".

In the National Foundation's 2021 Annual Report you will find all the information about the Foundation's activities and achievements, as well as indicators of success achieved through the activities of the contracted projects of civil society organisations and other beneficiaries.

I believe that in the Annual Report before you, you will find all the necessary information both through the text and the tables of the report, so I wish you a pleasant read.

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ABOUT THE NATIONAL FOUNDATION

The National Foundation for Civil Society Development was founded by the Republic of Croatia under the special Act on the National Foundation for Civil Society Development, adopted by the Croatian Parliament on 16 October 2003

The National Foundation was established with the basic purpose of promoting and supporting civil society development in the Republic of Croatia. The Foundation was registered on 24 November 2003, with the aim of providing professional and financial support to programmes promoting sustainability of the non-profit sector, cross-sector cooperation, civic initiatives, philanthropy and volunteering, and to programmes enhancing democratic institutions of the society.

Mission

The mission of the National Foundation is to promote and support civil society development in the Republic of Croatia.

Vision

With its activities, the National Foundation endeavours to achieve active citizenship in the development of a modern, democratic and inclusive society in the Republic of Croatia.



ACHIEVEMENTS AND SOCIO- ECONOMIC EFFECTS






The year 2021 was an extremely challenging one in which the world, Croatia included, continued to face the global COVID-19 pandemic and consequences of the earthquake. The National Foundation's achievements in 2021 in cooperation with civil society organisations were recognised both locally and by the international community, in particular:

- After the initial reaction to the global pandemic and the need for adaptation, the National Foundation continued to enhance its operations in terms of utilising all available digital tools related to the adaptation of business processes, of which it informed in a timely manner and provided support in this area to civil society organisations – beneficiaries of the National Foundation's support;
- As the coordinator of the Croatian Network for Cooperation in the Euro-Mediterranean, in November 2021 the National Foundation initiated the engagement of Croatia as one of the **42** countries of the Union for the Mediterranean in the first International Day of the Mediterranean on 28 November, thus spreading the message on the importance of strengthening Mediterranean identity and cooperation of countries of the Euro-Mediterranean space;
- In 2021, together with Belgium, France, Germany, Hungary, Italy, Lichtenstein, Russia, Serbia and Switzerland, the National Foundation for Civil Society Development got involved in the digital promotion of celebrating European Day of Foundations and Donors, when the European philanthropy sector gathers for a common goal: presentation of the role it plays in providing support to the society for the purpose of achieving general well-being, raising awareness of philanthropy, encouraging giving for public benefit, and civic actions;
- From 7 to 19 May 2021, the National Foundation carried out a public consultation on improving the National Foundation's activities in the period from 2021 to 2025, in which **1,261** people took part, with **5,218** textual responses recorded. Based on this consultation, the National Foundation's Development Office carried out an extensive results analysis which was published on its official website;
- On 25 January 2021, for **230** representatives of civil society organisations – beneficiaries of the its support – the National Foundation organised training on the subject of "New EU budget from 2021 to 2027 and next generation programs for civil society organisations in the Republic of Croatia";
- **13** schools got involved through the National Foundation's pilot programme in the 'DoGood People' international platform through which they encouraged children and youth to take up group challenges programmed for the purpose of achieving the UN global sustainable development goals by 2030;

- in 2021, the National Foundation's Development Office received and processed **712** applications for repurposing a part of the funds, and **1,117** programme and financial reports by civil society organisations – beneficiaries of the National Foundation's support;
- The Croatian Foundations Forum ZaDobroBIT! received **5** new members in 2021, hence the Forum now gathers **43** foundations active in the Republic of Croatia;
- In 2021, the National Foundation in cooperation with the European Foundation for Philanthropy and Social Development became involved in the international digital giving platform Transnational Giving Europe, together with **21** European states;
- As part of the cooperation between the National Foundation and IMPACT: Euro-Mediterranean Institution for Adult Education in Philanthropy and Social Development, **45** persons participated in three cycles of training focused on change makers. The trainings were organised with the cooperation, monitoring and professional support by international experts, after which the monitoring of the development of presented change makers' initiatives was continued through the "Community Potentials" programme"
- The National Foundation as the holder of the QUO VADIS EURO-MED CIVIL SOCIETY? project, together with the project partners Centre for International & European Studies at Kadir Has Un/ty (CIES, Turkey); IEMED (Spain); Fotoessa (Greece); House of Europe in Rhodes (Greece), in 2021 carried out a series of **8** highly informative webinars, which also included an assessment of the state of the civil society in the Euro-Mediterranean region since the signing of the Barcelona declaration, with the participation and contribution of the leaders of the national networks of the Anna Lindh Foundation – ALF;
- In 2021, with the aim of preparing well the new 4-year period of the National Foundation's activities from 2022 to 2025, the National Foundation's Development Office carried out a systematic analysis of programme support and all activities implemented in the period from 2018 to 2021, based on which it generated the documents 'Social impact of the Active in the Community programme implementation', 'Social impact of the development cooperation implementation', and 'Social impact of the civil society regional development programme in the Republic of Croatia'.

- In 2021, there were **2,165** persons involved in the implementation of approved EU projects in civil society organisations, with the total approved wages in the amount of **HRK 69,799,443.91**, while another **1,517** persons were involved through the disbursement of a second income, for which the approved amount was **HRK 18,812,004.93**;
- In 2021, the National Foundation as Intermediate Body Level 2 continued to work on the previously initiated digitalisation of business processes, while the development of a software for digital review of applications for reimbursement is currently in its final stage, and is expected to speed up the review and approval of applications, provide for a more systematic review of expenses and documents, and reduce the factor of human error, both on the side of beneficiaries and on the side of those performing the control;
- As Intermediate Body Level 2, in the 2014-2020 programming period the National Foundation contracted, in cooperation with Intermediate Bodies Level 1 and the Managing Authority, **862** projects with the total value of over **HRK 1,000,000,000.00** through a total of **23** calls for project proposals;
- In the period from 2017 to 2021, the National Foundation organized **156** workshops attended by over **2,000** participants, while in 2021 alone there were **35** implementation workshops and semi-annual meetings with a total of **609** beneficiaries;
- During 2021, **1,116** applications for reimbursement were approved. In order to approve the said applications successfully, the beneficiaries were requested as many as **1,885** supplementations to documentation, and the average time required by the beneficiaries to respond to the supplementation was **7** days;
- We successfully approved the amount of **HRK 172,271,371.28** through applications for reimbursement (AfR), which represents an increase by **62.62%** relative to 2020;

- There were **6** videos made on the implementation of ESF funded projects available on the National Foundation's official Vimeo channel from **6** different calls:

Development and expansion of the network of non-institutional services for Croatian war veterans and civil victims of the Homeland War

Areas of participation - Development of programmes to revitalise publicly owned premises through partnership between CSOs and the local community

Strengthening CSO capacities to popularise STEM

"Join - Active in Retirement" - Strengthening CSO capacities to improve the possibilities of active participation and social inclusion of retired persons

Thematic networks for socio-economic development and promotion of social dialogue in the context of improving labour conditions

- As Intermediate Body Level 2, in order to protect the environment and reduce the consumption of paper, in 2021 the National Foundation switched to using digital signatures resulting in **6,010** digitally signed documents in 2021;
- In the call "Strengthening CSO capacities to respond do the needs of the local community", in February 2021 we received a record number of project proposals, as many as **759**;
- Through the implementation support system we received and responded to **12,724** queries by beneficiaries of the European Social Fund;
- Throughout the duration of projects financed within the call "Strengthening CSO capacities to popularise STEM", through workshops and other activities there will be over **40,000** children and youth involved;
- The call "Join - Active in Retirement - Strengthening CSO capacities to improve the possibilities of active participation and social inclusion of retired persons", will involve over **18,000** retired persons.

SOCIO-ECONOMIC EFFECTS OF GRANTS

In 2021, the National Foundation for Civil Society Development monitored the implementation of **330** approved grants of which through development and programme cooperation it financed **45** CSOs/foundations, and through institutional grants **244** CSOs, while **13** grants pertain to the initiatives that are part of the "Community Potentials" programme, and **28** were financed by the Ministry of Croatian Veterans' Affairs.


Volunteers and GDP

In the **289** grants implemented by civil society organisations in 2021, there were about **17,000** participating volunteers with approximately **441,000** hours of volunteering engagement. If these volunteering hours were put into an economically measurable framework at the price of an average hourly wage in the Republic of Croatia, this volunteering engagement would be worth about **HRK 19,845,000.00**, which amounts to a share of about **0.0046%** in the GDP.

Employees and payments into the state budget

The **289** grants approved by the National Foundation in 2021 were also used to finance the salaries of **750** persons employed by CSOs, thus the contributions from the salaries of these persons accounted for about **HRK 15,030,000.00** paid into the state budget.

The **289** grants in 2021 encompassed about **2,200,000** direct beneficiaries


Sources of financing

Among the total of **1,237** programmes/projects implemented in 2021 by **289** CSOs which were awarded institutional grants by the National Foundation, the structure of their sources of financing is as follows:



Sustainability

Of the **289** organisations – beneficiaries of the National Foundation's grants in 2021, **83** (29%) did not and **206** (71%) did have developed self-financing related to generating revenue by performing activities, through*:



**some CSOs have more than one model of self-financing*

The collected data show that in 2021, CSOs generated funds amounting to approximately **HRK 24,500,000.00** through the self-financing activities described above.

Citizens' support

Of the **289** organisations – beneficiaries of the National Foundation's grants, **166** of them obtained citizens' donation in 2021 in the amount of approximately **HRK 10,300,000.00**

Cross-sector support

Of the **289** organisations – National Foundation's grant beneficiaries, **184** received donations from the profit sector in 2021 amounting to approximately **HRK 28,500,000.00**

EU funds

Of the **289** organisations – National Foundation's grant beneficiaries, **81** (28%) did not apply to EU calls in 2021, while **208** (72%) implemented **223** projects co-financed by EU funds in the value of approximately **HRK 189,460,000.00**. This suggests that CSOs receiving the National Foundation's grants attract **3** times more EU funding relative to the total resources invested in them through the Foundation's grants.

Membership

Of the **284** CSOs – institutional grant beneficiaries, **188** (66%) increased the number of their members in 2021 and **96** (34%) did not.

CONTRIBUTION OF THE NATIONAL FOUNDATION

Improvement of beneficiaries' capacities through grant implementation monitoring

In 2021, the National Foundation carried out **101** digital programme and financial pre-evaluations in CSOs from the entire territory of Croatia which through their activities contribute to democratisation and social development, and which were shortlisted for the approval of institutional grants in the **5** calls published for the award of institutional grants in 2021 (including **33** pre-evaluations in **2** calls for the implementation of which the National Foundation was in charge, while funding was provided by the Ministry of Croatian Veterans' Affairs and the Ministry of Economy and Sustainable Development).

During the implementation of approved multi-annual grants, the National Foundation conducts programme and financial evaluations of contracted grants implementation, and based on the evaluation results, among other, bases are established for the extension or continuation of grant financing in the following year. Given the emergency situation caused by COVID-19 and the stipulated epidemiological measures, in 2021 there were **28** such evaluations carried out, which showed that the majority of CSOs had no difficulties in their work in terms of implementing the activities set out in the strategic and operational plan, and of transparency of their operations, including the financial part of the implementation of approved grants.

Furthermore, in order to familiarise the beneficiaries of approved institutional grants with the method of grant implementation and efficient reporting, an online workshop was held in January 2021 for the beneficiaries of **83** grants approved in **4** calls published in August 2020 (for which grant implementation commenced in January 2021), and in July 2021 an online workshop was held for the beneficiaries of **28** grants approved in the call published in January 2021 (for the CSOs from the Homeland War, for which grant implementation commenced in June 2021, with the funding by the Ministry of Croatian Veterans' Affairs).

EFFICIENT INVESTMENT FROM PUBLIC SOURCES

The National Foundation systematically evaluates the programme and financial part of the implementation of approved grants, with the aim of determining the efficiency of investments and the level of change occurring in the local community and the society due to grant implementation, in order to be able to adjust accordingly its priorities and approval process for grants through which it fulfils its basic purpose and mission.

Efficient investment from public sources is achieved through a systematic allocation procedure which includes:

Once it processes the final reports, the National Foundation requests a return of the funds disbursed for the implementation of the approved grant if it finds they have not been spent entirely for the implementation of the approved grant in accordance with the agreed specification of costs of grant implementation, which constitutes an integral part of the contract/agreement.

In 2021, the unspent funds and ineligible costs amounted to **HRK 979,069.71** and were returned to the National Foundation's account by the respective beneficiaries.

• Organising training for grant beneficiaries


In January 2021, the National Foundation organised a webinar for interested beneficiaries of the National Foundation's grants, on the subject of "New EU budget 2021-2027 and next generation programs for CSOs in the Republic of Croatia."

This webinar was attended by **230** representatives of organisations – beneficiaries of the National Foundation's grants, and the said training was intended for employees and members of the organisation's management bodies with the aim of improving the organisational development and/or stabilising the work of the organisations using public funding.

Due to modified operations and inability to provide proper conditions during 2021 due to the global pandemic, the National Foundation was unable to organise live training or coordination meetings.

• Beneficiary satisfaction

A survey carried out among **289** supported organisations on their satisfaction with the cooperation with the National Foundation yielded the following results:

PRESERVATION OF THE ENVIRONMENT

- By streamlining operations



Online applications to calls and the submission of reports through the platform www.financijskepodrske.hr made it possible to generate the entire documentation in electronic/digital form, while the only thing submitted via regular mail on paper is the certified and signed document of application/report verification, however, due to the global pandemic, that part of the process was also done via e-mail.

In 2021, in the National Foundation's **5** implemented calls, via the www.financijskepodrske.hr platform (used by other public administration bodies as well), a total of **263** applications were received and forwarded in electronic form to members of evaluation bodies (five for each evaluation), and throughout the year a total of **1,117** programme and financial reports were received on the implementation of approved grants, which in addition to the stipulated forms also comprise attachments documenting the activities implemented and approved funds spent (the data pertain to the final reports for 2020 which are received in January 2021 and to quarterly periods (for institutional grants) and four-month periods (for programme cooperation) for 2021, but not to the final reports for 2021 which are received in mid-January 2022).

This represents a major contribution to the preservation of the environment by not using paper documentation, since otherwise it would require cutting down young trees and wasting significant amounts of water for their processing, and would pollute the environment with a certain amount of oil. This contribution is all the greater because the portal www.financijske.podrske.hr was upgraded with a new module allowing for electronic applications for participation in various events organised by the National Foundation.



Employee structure



SUPPORT IN 2021

In 2021, the National Foundation for Civil Society Development ensured the continuity of implementation of **302** grants and activities related to democratisation and civil society development, organisational development (institutional grants), regional development, community development, centres of knowledge for social development, and development of philanthropy, for which it disbursed funds in the amount of **HRK 52,897,158.20**.

In addition to the above, in cooperation with the Ministry of Croatian Veterans' Affairs, in 2021 the National Foundation approved **28** institutional grants for CSOs from the Homeland War, the implementation of which commenced on 1 June 2021 (first year of implementation), for which the Ministry disbursed funds in the amount of **HRK 1,820,000.00** (70% of the contracted amount for the first year of implementation 2021/2022).

TRANSPARENCY AND CRITERIA

Grants of the National Foundation for Civil Society Development are awarded through public calls in accordance with the annual calendar of publication of calls for proposals and calls for expression of interest in cooperation, published in December of the current year for the following year and available on the National Foundation's website and publicly presented on Info Days. The National Foundation's grant allocation plan and calendar of publication of calls in 2021 was adopted at the Management Board session held on 9 December 2020.

All of the calls have specified objectives to be achieved through them and complete call documentation with the application criteria published. In addition to the call documentation, the evaluation form is also published for the applicants to know based on which criteria all of the applications are evaluated.

The applications that meet the basic stipulated criteria of the call are referred to evaluation by independent evaluation bodies the members of which independently evaluate applications through the computer system Potpora_Plus (potpora = grant), which generates all evaluation results and then ranks them by quality and by the score achieved. Best quality applications are approved for grant funding and conclusion of a financing agreement, followed by monitoring of the efficiency of their implementation.

A specific feature of the call for the allocation of institutional grants to CSO stabilisation and/or development is that it is carried out in two parts. In the first part of the call, all interested CSOs meeting the stipulated (technical) conditions can apply for institutional grants by 23 February 2021 (for the 1 call published on 25 January 2021), or by 15 September 2021 (for the 4 calls published on 17 August 2021). The second part of the call commences with shortlisting CSOs in each institutional grant category, which shortlist includes the CSOs that have been assessed with the highest score, after which the National Foundation's professional staff evaluates the programme activities and financial operations of the CSOs. Taking into consideration this evaluation, the final assessment and ranking of applications are carried out, after which the decision on grant approval is made, the financing agreement is concluded, and implementation efficiency is monitored over a three-year period.

Access to information

As a public authority, pursuant to the provisions of the Right of Access to Information Act the National Foundation is obliged to submit requested information to applicants. In 2021, the National Foundation received 3 requests of access to information from **3** different applicants.

Of the **3** received requests, **1** pertained to the National Foundation's operations, and **2** requests pertained to information on the implementation of projects approved from the European Social Fund. The said information was requested for **2** CSOs and the applicants received their applications for reimbursement with all attachments.

INSTITUTIONAL GRANTS - INVESTMENT INTO CSO DEVELOPMENT

Institutional grants represent a specific part of the National Foundation's grants programme through which investments are made in a targeted manner, for a three-year period, into the organisational development or stabilisation of CSOs registered in the Republic of Croatia, all with the aim of raising the level of sustainability of the CSOs contributing to democratisation and social development in the Republic of Croatia.

The year 2021 saw continued financing of institutional grants approved in the **4** calls published in August 2018 (third year of implementation), **4** calls published in August 2019 (second year of implementation), and the initiation of financing and implementation of institutional grants approved in the **4** calls published in August 2020 (first year of implementation), as well as the financing and implementation of **3** institutional grants by redirecting CSOs involved in the previous initial programme cooperation, with the allocation of the equivalent grant amount.

Furthermore, in late December institutional grants were contracted subsequent to the 3 new calls launched in August 2021, the implementation of which is to commence in January 2022.

Under the Agreement on development cooperation through systematic investments into the development of CSOs from the Homeland War, concluded with the Ministry of Croatian Veterans' Affairs, in January 2021 the National Foundation published a call based on which **28** institutional grants were approved for CSOs from the Homeland War the implementation of which (first year) commenced on 1 June 2021, and for which the funding was provided by the Ministry of Croatian Veterans' Affairs, while the entire call procedure and monitoring of the approved grants are under the purview of the National Foundation.

In addition to the above, under the Agreement on development cooperation through systematic investments into the development of CSOs for consumer protection, concluded with the Ministry of Economy and Sustainable Development in August 2021, the National Foundation published a call based on which 4 institutional grants were approved for CSOs for consumer protection the implementation of which (first year) commences in 2022, and for which the funding was provided by the Ministry of Economy and Sustainable Development, while the entire call procedure and monitoring of the approved grants are under the purview of the National Foundation.

In 2021 there were **272** institutional grants under implementation (third, second and first year of implementation), of which **244** were financed by the National Foundation, and **28** by the Ministry of Croatian Veterans' Affairs





REGIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Since 2007, through partnership with 5 regional specialised networks, the National Foundation for Civil Society Development has been implementing the regional development programme to strengthen the capacities of CSOs and other legal entities in the region of Dalmatia, central Croatia, north-western Croatia, western and eastern Croatia.

By providing systematic support in the area of information, consultations and training on the local and regional levels, the National Foundation contributes to the harmonisation of regional development and CSO and civil initiatives' capacities. The programme is implemented with five partner organisations from Osijek, Split, Zagreb, Rijeka and Čakovec through the provision of services that strengthen CSO capacities in cooperation with the central support units and regional branches of the National Foundation, and in 2021 the programme was implemented in cooperation with five partner organisations: MI Association, Split; Association for Civil Society Development SMART, Rijeka; DKolektiv – organisation for social development, Osijek; Centre for Civil Initiatives, Zagreb, and ACT Group, Čakovec.

The programme is focused on providing information, consultations and training to CSOs in order to contribute to their professionalism and performance. The regional development programme includes the following training programmes:

- Project cycle management and assessment of needs in the local community
- Volunteer management
- Quality system in civil society organisations with examples of efficient management models
- Quality assurance in the implementation of projects financed from public sources
- Innovative fundraising models for CSO activities
- Advocacy models for positive changes in the local communities
- Models of citizens' engagement in the work of CSOs
- How to develop a strategic and operational plan for a CSO
- Social capital development in the local community and partnership/cooperation models for CSO in the community
- Models of internal and external evaluations of CSO activities/programmes

This way, the partner organisations in the implementation of the regional development programme are tasked with providing support to civil society organisations in the local communities, and also with providing support to the applicants to EU funds.

The type of content offered by training changed in terms of quality and quantity and was adapted to the new work mode due to the need for a more efficient evaluation and transfer of knowledge in digital form as well. In some of the organisations involved in the programme implementation, an increased level of interest among the beneficiaries, i.e. CSOs was noted for the use of training and consultation services relative to the previous years.

PROGRAMMES IN REGIONS

ACT GROUP

Čakovec



In 2021, as part of the regional development programme, the partner organisation ACT Group held **17** workshops with a total of **257** participants, while consultation services were provided to **85** representatives of CSOs. In compliance with the recommendations on the prevention of further spread of the COVID-19 pandemic, a part of the planned training activities within the programme was held in the digital setting, which ultimately resulted in increased interest in the workshops among beneficiaries, with the highest attendance reported for the digital workshop on the subject of 'Project cycle management and assessment of needs in the local community', attended by **22** participants. The organisation's website was visited by **14,088** individual visitors, and there were 100 media releases on its work. A significant result in 2021 for ACT Group is the establishment of a new structure and processes for better management of the organisation, which was implemented throughout the year and helped avoid a more significant impact of the COVID-19 crisis on the organisation's overall operations, all the while opening new markets on which the organisation became focused.

DKOLEKTIV – ORGANISATION FOR SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT



Osijek

During 2021, DKolektiv – organisation for social development as a partner organisation, despite all the obstacles related to the pandemic, implemented a total of **10** workshops with **218** direct beneficiaries. The digital workshop on the subject of 'Innovative fundraising models for CSOs' had the highest attendance, with **49** participants, and was implemented via the ZOOM online platform. Due to the adaptation to a new way of transferring and facilitating knowledge, the workshops were shorter in duration than in the previous years, but because of that required higher engagement in terms of human resources and were altered in terms of content for the participants to receive content of equal quality as before. In 2020, the organisation changed its name from Volunteer Centre Osijek to DKolektiv – organisation for social development, which is why there was an increased number of activities related to the visibility and management of the new identity. In that regard, the organisation's website recorded **21,374** single visits, while the media featured **71** releases on the organisation's work, and on its social networks and website the organisation published **777** news items.

'MI' ASSOCIATION

Split



During 2021, this partner organisation held **10** workshops in the digital setting, which were for that purpose adapted to the new mode of implementation due to the circumstances caused by the pandemic, and there was a noticeable increase in the number of beneficiaries compared to the previous years, hence the regional development programme included **439** direct beneficiaries, with

the highest attendance reported for the workshop on the subject of 'Project cycle management and assessment of needs in the local community' with **75** participants. During 2021 through programme implementation, the organisation provided consultation services focused on increasing the capacities of CSOs and regional communities, as well as on empowering beneficiaries to absorb funds and informing them on the possibilities of financing from EU or national/regional/local sources. In terms of visibility, the interactive e-mail list was systematically updated, and an online forum intended for civil society was also used, while the organisation recorded **40,000** visits to its website, where it published **91** news items, and the number of media releases related to the organisation's activities was **184**.

CENTRE FOR CIVIL INITIATIVES

Zagreb



In the implementation of the regional development programme throughout 2021, the Centre for Civil Initiatives held **10** workshops with a total of **234** beneficiaries, also providing **42** consultation services to representatives of CSOs, foundations and artistic organisations. Training and consultation services were mostly carried out in the digital setting, and the largest number of interested beneficiaries participated in the workshop on the subject of 'How do develop a strategic and operational plan for CSOs?' with **39** participants, which was provided on the Zoom platform. Although the altered mode of holding workshops has its disadvantages, it did enable CSOs from very distant regions to participate in the regional development programme, which contributed to engaging a larger number of volunteers in the work of those organisations, as well as of local self-government units in their financing, all the while helping achieve good cooperation among the beneficiaries after the workshops. The organisation's website was visited by **11,075** single visitors, there featured **29** posts.

ASSOCIATION FOR CIVIL SOCIETY DEVELOPMENT - SMART

Rijeka



In 2021, as part of the regional development programme, the Association for Civil Society Development - SMART organised **10** workshops with a total of **149** direct beneficiaries, with the highest number of participants in the workshop on the subject of 'Advocacy models for positive changes in the local communities' with **20** beneficiaries, which was held on the Zoom digital platform. Despite the challenges caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, in 2021 the organisation successfully carried out all planned activities and continued adapting its work, which implied a new approach in the work related to the programme implementation which was focused on the new implementation method via digital tools. A large share of the activities during the said period was related to consultations and information for civil society organisations in terms of crisis volunteering, for the purpose of which research of needs and the current situation among organisers of volunteering was conducted. During 2021, the organisation's website had **20,111** visits, and there were **232** articles published on it.

ACTIVE IN THE COMMUNITY

Programme cooperation in the area of support to civil society organisations and local communities called "Active in the Community", has been implemented through partnership with four partner foundations: Community Foundation "Slagalica", Regional Foundation for Local Development "Momentum", "Kajo Dadić" Foundation Split, and the Foundation for Partnership and Civil Society Development.

The programme is implemented through financing, creating professional and technical preconditions, establishing the area and type of activity, and constantly improving and training actors and all stakeholders in the programme implementation, while the National Foundation, in cooperation with partner foundations, provides for programme harmonisation and integrity on the entire Croatian territory, in order for the same type of activities to be implemented in all counties and involved local communities.




Partner foundations develop activities in the field of:

- Social capital development in local communities
- Development of the culture of giving for public benefit in local communities
- Implementation of social programmes in local communities

In the implementation of these activities, in 2021 each of the partner foundations encompassed at least 10 local communities in which discussions were held on social capital development, and an analysis (mapping) was conducted of the state of affairs in terms of social capital development, with recommendations for further improvements. Based on these analyses, the partner foundations in cooperation with local communities designed and implemented models to develop the culture of giving for public benefit and for fundraising for identified needs in the local community, by connecting citizens, civil initiatives, CSOs and all other stakeholders in the local community and their joint action. Finally, the partner foundations in cooperation with all the stakeholders implemented, based on the previously implemented fundraising models, social programmes that were financed with the funds raised.

In the challenging year of 2021 marked by the COVID-19 pandemic, organisations carried out a part of their activities in the digital setting via available online platforms, primarily in terms of training, analysis of the current state of affairs in the civil society, and development of recommendations, while civil initiatives and initiatives related to the development of the culture of giving were mostly carried out live in compliance with all epidemiological measures. For that reason, some of the originally planned activities in the area of social programmes in local communities were carried out in a somewhat reduced and modified scope.



Through development cooperation with the National Foundation, the Centres of Knowledge implement:

- Research and analysis of public policies in the area of activities;
- Transfer of specific knowledge in the Republic of Croatia and in the countries of Southeast Europe;
- Development of social potentials;
- Advocacy for positive social change.

The most significant activities of the Centres of Knowledge in 2021:

ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION, SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT AND USE OF RENEWABLE ENERGY SOURCES

In 2021, the Centre of Knowledge in the area of environmental protection, sustainable development and use of renewable energy sources organised the traditional Fall Eco-Seminar in digital form, with the aim of educating and informing people through 8 presentation and activist weekend-workshops on the issues of sustainability and environmental protection, but also to foster critical thinking and action.

The programme of this Centre of Knowledge titled Green Phone, a service for information on and reports of environmental issues, in 2021 received **1,162** reports and questions related to environmental issues, the majority of which were related to waste management. In that regard, they continued with the campaign “Zagreb – The European Capital of Waste”, and implemented a series of activities within the framework of advocacy campaigns for better waste management policies. They continued to develop actively the Facebook platform Zero Waste Croatia Network, on which on a daily basis they inform citizens on how to reduce waste, and of good practices, success stories of cities and municipalities, but also of detrimental projects planned in the Republic of Croatia and beyond.

Despite the COVID-19 pandemic and in compliance with epidemiological measures, the so called *Biciklopopravljiona*, a unique volunteer bicycle repair shop, continued with its activities and in 2021 received the “Pride of Croatia” award for its overall work to date. In 2021, **356** bicycles were repaired in *Biciklopopravljiona*, and **253** were restored and donated, mostly to persons of lower economic status.

Members of the Centre of Knowledge continued to participate actively in the work of the Council for GMO, SEE NET network as well as in the working bodies for waste management of international networks such as Zero Waste Europe, Break Free from Plastic Movement, Friends of the Earth Europe, IPEN and the European Environmental Bureau. In addition to the above, they were very active in advocating for positive social change in the area of their activity by organising drives, protests, forums, round tables, but also by conducting analyses and through media communications.

Moreover, in 2021 the Centre of Knowledge held the 8th Environmental Film Festival over three days, with the programme encompassing 18 documentary, feature and animated films, literary evenings, exhibitions of student posters, as well as workshops of “climate collage” for the public. The festival was also an opportunity to present the students’ edition of the book “Homo Climaticum 2021”.

In late 2021, the Green Action Activist Group launched a new portal titled Aktivizam.hr! envisaged as a place to get information, inspiration and connect CSOs, collectives and individuals eager for change and ready for social contribution and solidarity. The portal makes it possible to easily find activities that the broader public can participate in, such as workshops, courses, community service, forums, protests, volunteering etc.

CIVIC ACTIVISM AND DEVELOPMENT OF DEMOCRATIC INSTITUTIONS IN THE SOCIETY

During 2021, the Centre of Knowledge for Social Development in the area of civic activism and development of democratic institutions in the society continuously monitored the work of fundamental political institutions and other public, autonomous and independent bodies.

The activities of the Centre of Knowledge were adapted for implementation in digital format, with an emphasis on completed interactive webinars on the Thinkific platform. The year 2021 was the first in which a two-day training was held - Anticorruption Module, for interested citizens with the main aim of offering participants insights into the causes and consequences of corruption as an everyday practice in the lives of individuals. The Open Data Days in 2021 were organized by the Centre of Knowledge together with Code for Croatia. Activities commenced with the conference on "Open data against the infodemic", which could be followed via social networks and YouTube channel, and was continued with an online weekend hackathon. Together with the organisations *Zašto ne* (Why Not) from Sarajevo and *Danes je nov dan* (Today Is a New Day) from Ljubljana, the Centre of Knowledge organised a regional conference on "Legislative Openness" in Sarajevo, where delegates and representatives of administrative staff from Croatia, Bosnia and Herzegovina and Slovenia discussed the openness and efficiency of legislative authorities during the COVID-19 pandemic, with the conclusion that the pandemic has had a negative impact on the transparency of the work of parliaments in the region.

Activities of the Centre of Knowledge in 2021 were focused on strengthening analytical baselines for other information, advocacy and education activities in the coming years. In that regard, a survey of political literacy was carried out among secondary school seniors, as well as a study of institutional vulnerabilities to corruption and media pressure. With regular publication of monitoring communications and reports which included constructive proposals for improvement of election processes, this year the Centre of Knowledge also implemented a campaign to encourage citizens to participate in the local elections in order to raise public awareness about their importance, and increase their legitimacy as being elections that are no less important than the ones on the national level.

Further development of the online portals *MozaikVeza*, *Parlamehtar*, *ImamoPravoZnati* and *Faktograf* helped increase transparency of the work of legislative institutions, tools were created to combat corruption, citizens' right to information was facilitated, and contributions were made to the fight against disinformation as well as the promotion of verified information in the public sphere by regular fact-checking.

Members of the Centre of Knowledge were active in the work of the Council for the Prevention of Corruption, Partnership for Open Government, and the Council for Civil Society Development, within which they could directly influence the adoption of public policies, while in the area of cooperation they continued networking with civil society organisations in Croatia and EU, trade unions, employees of public institutions and investigative reporters, civil "hacktivists". In all of this of special note is the cooperation of the Centre of Knowledge with CroSol - Croatian Platform for International Citizen Solidarity, GOOD initiative, European Civic Forum, and the networks ENEMO and ALTER EU.

SOCIAL INCLUSION AND REDUCTION OF POVERTY

During 2021, the Centre of Knowledge for Social Development in the area of social inclusion and reduction of poverty implemented a series of programmes, projects, campaigns, workshops, forums and public drives in which it cooperated with all relevant stakeholders in the area of social welfare, education, justice, police on the local and national level, as well as with the authorities in terms of cooperation with the local and regional self-government, while the activities of the Centre of Knowledge were visible to the public via social networks, which resulted in active engagement of volunteers.

In 2021, in cooperation with the St. Jerome association and the Croatian Homeless Network and CERANEO association, the Centre of Knowledge was the host of the 15th National Meeting on Homelessness, which takes place every year on the occasion of the World Homeless Day. On that occasion the Centre of Knowledge organised a conference titled "The Faces of Homelessness", and held a presentation of the publication titled "Poverty – a Stain on the Consciousness of Humanity", which speaks up about this significant global social problem and is aimed at focusing on the issues of poverty and social exclusion, pointing out all the resources and opportunities for help and support that exist in Croatia.

In late 2021 they launched a study of activism and volunteer work of primary and secondary school students in the area of Split and Split-Dalmatia County, in order to gain insight into the volunteering activities undertaken by children and youth in their own schools, ways in which volunteering is encouraged and affirmed in schools, obstacles encountered by leaders and coordinators, and recommendations as to what to improve and how. They also carried out several advocacy campaigns on the topic of health insurance for the homeless, exercise of the right to an ID for the homeless, mental health of the youth etc.

In 2020 the Centre of Knowledge celebrated the 20th anniversary of the opening of the Homeless Centre in which they provided care for over **2,000** persons without a home, organised thousands of major and minor donation drives, and included thousands of volunteers from the territory of the city and the county in different activities and projects. On that occasion, in 2021 the Centre of Knowledge published a brochure titled "Thank you", to thank all their beneficiaries, workers, donors, supporters and friends.

In 2021 they also organised two very successful promotional and sales drives titled "Split Style by MoSt". In the stands, beneficiaries sold products, and the revenues were directed exclusively to the beneficiaries and procurement of new materials. They also organised the 20th consecutive traditional humanitarian drive "And where are you?!" on the Split waterfront in order to raise funds for the Homeless Centre and promote solidarity and volunteering.

YOUTH ACTIVITIES



In 2021, the Centre of Knowledge in the area of youth activities continued to empower young people for active and responsible participation in the society, contributed to the development of proper youth policies and the civil society. Members of the Centre of Knowledge took part in various workshops, trainings, conferences, and also organised many themselves, thus in cooperation with the association DrONE and the Council of Europe they carried out Human Rights Education (HRE), training intended for persons working actively in the area of human rights protection and advocating for education for human rights, and persons working actively with youth who had previously had little or no experience of working in education for human rights. Furthermore, together with the MoSt Association they organised a webinar on the “Challenges of Growing Up”, where they touched upon various challenges of growing up that can be demanding to cope with, not just for young people, but also for their families and loved ones, as well as for experts.

The Centre of Knowledge had an opportunity to participate in the organisation and implementation of the conference on “Working with Youth Pending: Academic Stance on Training and Education for Working with Youth”, which gathered relevant European and Croatian experts in the field of working with youth and put on the agenda burning topics and issues currently encountered in working with youth. At the conference, the Centre of Knowledge organised a panel discussion on “Working with youth – yesterday, today, tomorrow? – A retrospective of working with youth in Croatia.”

The Centre of Knowledge took part in the organisation and implementation of an online conference on social and cultural centres in Banija, titled “Community in Focus”, where they investigated the needs of the community in Sisak and Petrinja, and presented so called social and cultural centres and how they meet the needs and contribute to the development of the community. The said conference preceded the crowdfunding campaign “Community in focus – so I can have a place to... live”, the aim of which was to raise funds to establish and furnish two social and cultural centres in Petrinja and Sisaka and during which sufficient funds were raised to launch the social and cultural centres and some of their activities. In the area of influencing public policies on the national and international level, of note is that members of the Centre of Knowledge actively participated in the national task force for the implementation of EU Youth Dialogue, task force for the elaboration of criteria for the certificate “Youth Friendly City”, as well as in the Youth Council of the Croatian Government and Council for Civil Society Development, and on the international level at the meetings of the European Youth Forum and in various panels and expert forums.

In order to help youth and adults take part in digital self-census for the needs of the 2021 Census, the Centre of Knowledge developed the so called “Guide to e-Galaxy: From e-Student to e-Citizen” aligned with the 2021 Census methodology. In addition to this, in 2021 the Centre of Knowledge issued several publications in the area of its activities: “Youth and COVID-1: Impact of the pandemic on youth and youth organisations”, “Youth Guarantee Quality Standards”, “Theory and practice of working with youth: A contribution to understanding working with youth in Croatia 2.0”, as well as the “Position paper of the Croatian Youth Network on working with youth.”

During 2021, the Centre of Knowledge for Social Development in the area of independent culture implemented the 21st continuous cycle of programme exchange and cooperation with the participation of **38**, featuring **73** individual cultural and artistic events in **17** cities and locations in Croatia, and the participation of over **3,900** citizens, most of which were young people, and with over **85%** of all content taking place outside the capital.

The 14th Clubture Forum took place in Osijek, as a gathering of independent culture organisations, and was attended by **35** representatives of organisations from different parts of Croatia. During the two-day programme, representatives of member organisations, but also of local organisations, were informed of the implementation of programmes of the Centre of Knowledge, exchanged information on their work in the preceding period, met new implementers of the CTHR programme, agreed on future cooperation and became familiar with the independent culture scene of Osijek.

The Centre of Knowledge continued to work on increasing the visibility of the network and independent culture scene through the development of an interactive archival map of content implemented through the programme “Clubture-Hr: Programme exchange and cooperation”, digitalisation of the organisational archives, and public campaign for the upcoming 20th anniversary of the network to be observed in 2022, for which occasion they developed a publication titled “Clubture network – 20 years of exchange and cooperation”, elaborating on the ideas and values which were the baseline for the organisation, key programmes and elements of their development.

As part of its work on analysing the impact of coronavirus on the work of organisations in independent culture, the second part of analysis was carried out in 2021, with suggestions and proposals addressed to the Ministry of Culture and Media that can serve to strengthen the existing and create new mechanisms of assistance to the independent culture sector. Moreover, also analysed was the impact of financing from the European Social Fund on organisations in independent culture in Croatia, which will serve to develop recommendations to the authorities when programming the new programming period of 2021-2027.

The Centre of Knowledge is systematically involved in monitoring the development and implementation of public policies in the areas of its activities through direct advocacy and public consultations, but also through the work of the Council for Civil Society Development, as well as within numerous networks and platforms in Croatia. Furthermore, it actively participates in monitoring European cultural policies through participation in the regional organisation *Kooperativa* – Regional Platform for Culture, and through following the activities of the international organisations network Culture Action Europe.

SUSTAINABLE LIVING AND DEVELOPMENT OF PERMACULTURE



During 2021, despite the COVID-19 pandemic, the Centre of Knowledge for Social Development in the area of sustainable living and development of permaculture organised several conferences, workshops and trainings on the subject of good economy, sustainable development and natural building, with active participation in partner national and international networks. Environmentally minded developers, creators, funders and all aficionados of traditional and natural architecture were gathered by the Centre of Knowledge at the 5th Natural Building Convention.

They also organised the 5th Conference on Our Good Food, which featured discussions on the necessary changes in food and agricultural policies, preservation of agrobiodiversity, solidary short supply chains and positive examples of organic production models from Croatia. The 7th Conference on good economy was organised by the Centre of Knowledge in 2021 in hybrid form with the permitted number of participants attending live and with live streaming and participation of all interested parties. In 2021 the Centre of Knowledge also organised the festival Three Piglets – the first children's permaculture festival organised with the aim of familiarising children with the beauty of natural building by learning skills of building with natural materials. The Recycled Estate was also the venue of the Natural Building Academy which consisted of three modules in **12** education work days, **12** lectures and **96** hours of practical work learning about tool handling, natural building materials and construction of ecological and energy efficient houses in practice.

Through participation in conferences and seminars of other organisations, the Centre of Knowledge worked on transfer of knowledge, as well as through the work of the free citizens counselling centre within which in 2021 they conducted **267** counselling sessions via e-mail, social networks, telephone conversations and live during visits to the Recycled Estate.

As part of the public policy research and analysis, in 2021 the Centre of Knowledge issued the following publications: Study – results of the solidary short supply chain research in Croatia, study titled Our Green Future – Development possibilities for green economy in Montenegro, Serbia, North Macedonia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, and Albania, and a City Manual – development of social and solidary economy through public policies. As part of the Community Seed Bank, they also prepared and issued several publications: Sowing manual which tells you everything you need to know about seedlings for your garden, Newsletter intended for Community Seed Bank members, and a Seed Merchant Catalogue which gathers verified gardeners and seed merchants, active members of the Community Seed Bank, who also greatly contributed to the preservation of various varieties precisely through seed regeneration. Moreover, they printed the handbook titled Educational Modules – Social and Solidary Economy for Vocational Education and Training – educational material divided into four modules aimed at promoting social and solidary economy within the vocational education and training system. In addition to the above, they also prepared and presented ten educational guides on "What children need to know about sustainable development", which in a simple, fun and creative way teach sustainable development and living, and are designed in the shape of a poster or map that can always be used for teaching.

In 2021, the Centre of Knowledge for Social Development in the area of the protection and promotion of human rights continued its activities and ongoing advocacy in the area of freedom of speech, suppression of hate speech, protection of whistleblowers, and promotion of human rights on the local level. As part of its continued activities, in the said period they also published the report on “Human Rights in Croatia: Overview of 2020”, which was drafted based on systematic year-long monitoring and contributions from more than **40** civil society organisations. In addition to this, they continuously conducted surveys and monitored the state of human rights for 2021 for the purpose of preparing a new report.

In the said period, the Centre of Knowledge held the Annual Human Rights Conference, which took place in two parts. The first part of the conference, which was streamed live on social networks of the Human Rights House and YouTube channel, featured a presentation of the report on “Human Rights in Croatia: Overview of 2020”, and discussions on the topic of human rights in earthquake-stricken areas. The second day of the conference was held in digital format, and included two panel discussions: impact of slander, disgrace and defamation suits on freedom of the media in Croatia, and the whistleblower protection system on the eve of the transposition of the new EU directive.

The Centre of Knowledge regularly receives citizens’ complaints on alleged violations of their fundamental human rights and queries on the possibilities of their protection, which it then refers to the competent institutions and providers of free legal aid which with their area of activity are best equipped to address the presented issues. In 2021, a total of **81** queries were received.

Through its partner networks, the Centre of Knowledge participated in the most significant activities aimed at promoting the achieved standards of human rights, democracy, rule of law, and social justice. The Centre of Knowledge actively participated in the work of the Council for Civil Society Development and the Ombudswoman’s Council, and implemented advocacy activities by organising and participating in round tables, conferences, media appearances, as well as activities within the GOOD Initiative and through the work of networks, INACH and the Human Rights House Network. The said activities yielded results in terms of a systematic and constructive approach to and participation in public discussions on draft legislation and public policies, while advocacy for and promotion of human rights in the public and among all social groups represented a continuous task tackled by the Centre of Knowledge.

IMPROVEMENT OF THE QUALITY OF LIFE OF PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES

The Centre of Knowledge for Social Development in the area of improvement of the quality of life of persons with disabilities (8th Centre of Knowledge), which gathers 13 alliances of CSOs of persons with disabilities, in 2021 continued to work systematically on promoting the human rights of persons with disabilities. In that regard, on the occasion of the International Human Rights Day the Centre of Knowledge organised a round table on the “Human rights approach to disability”, which featured several presentations followed by a discussion related to over 500,000 persons with disability and children with developmental difficulties who are still encountering obstacles in access to education and employment, healthcare, culture and sports, affordable housing, and cannot count on some of the basic social services that would enable them to live independently in the community. In view of the above, in 2021 the Centre of Knowledge launched the campaign titled “Is adequate housing a lottery for persons with disabilities in Croatia?”, with the aim of developing an adequate legal framework for social housing in the Republic of Croatia comprised of the Social Housing Act and the Croatian Housing Policy Strategy by 2030. The campaign was preceded by a survey of attitudes and needs of persons with disabilities related to adequate housing, which included **526** respondents, persons with disabilities.

The campaign also included the drafting of the Position Document of the 8th Centre of Knowledge on the need for enactment of the Social Housing Act to enable persons with disabilities in Croatia to exercise their rights to dignified and affordable housing, as well as a promotional video which was promoted together with campaign objectives at the press conference on the occasion of the observation of the International Day of Persons with Disabilities on 3 December. In addition to the above, there was an international online panel discussion on “Adequate housing of persons with disabilities in Croatia and the region – good and bad practice examples”, where it was highlighted that the situation was extremely unfavourable, prices of accommodation had risen, and the movement of persons with disability had been fighting for a number of years for the enactment of the Social Housing Act.

Organisations of the 8th Centre of Knowledge for Social Development influenced social development and public policies in the area of improving the quality of life of persons with disabilities by organising and participating in training sessions, forums, workshops and campaigns that they implemented throughout 2021, despite the challenges and circumstances brought about by the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, which sometimes required a modification and organisation of activities in digital format. In 2021, the Croatian Union of Associations of Persons with Disabilities (SOIH) launched an educational platform – Virtual learning forum on the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (CRPD), designed as an innovative model of implementing activities of the 8th Centre of Knowledge for Social Development in Croatia in the area of transfer of specific knowledge. For that purpose, there are continuous training sessions held for members of the management bodies and employees of unions and associations of persons with disabilities on CRPD and policies contributing to the enforcement of CRPD.

In addition, a joint coordination meeting was held in October 2021, organised by the National Foundation with the representatives of partner organisations involved in all 9 Centres of Knowledge in hybrid format. The meeting featured a presentation of the new four-year period of the National Foundation's activities for 2022-2025, priority areas and models of CSO engagement in financing in the new multiannual period of using ESI funds (ESF+), and improvements in the implementation of development cooperation (2022-2025 period).

The partner organisations of the 8th Centre of Knowledge continued to feed the Knowledge Bases established on their websites with documentation relevant to the transfer of knowledge in the area of activities of the Centre of Knowledge including publications, training materials, and video and audio documentation.

In 2021, a total of **212** employees actively participated in and thus contributed to the numerous activities carried out within the Centre of Knowledge in the area of improvement of the quality of life of persons with disabilities.

There were **201** volunteers participating in the programmes, with a total of **3,685** volunteering hours. The implementation of numerous activities included **50,758** direct beneficiaries, and in the previous period the unions had **477** media releases.



IMPROVEMENT OF THE QUALITY OF LIFE OF CROATIAN VETERANS AND CIVIL VICTIMS OF THE HOMELAND WAR



Pursuant to the Agreement on Development Cooperation, fifteen partner organisations from the Homeland War involved in the Centre of Knowledge for Social Development in the area of improvement of the quality of life of Croatian Veterans and civil victims of the Homeland War (9th Centre of Knowledge) continued their activities throughout 2021. CSOs of veterans of the Homeland War organised a joint international conference titled “30 Years in Unity”.

The conference was opened by the Croatian deputy prime minister and minister of Croatian veterans’ affairs, while representatives of the Ministry of Croatian Veterans’ Affairs presented the current legislative package: Act on Croatian Homeland War Veterans and Their Family Members. In addition, the conference also featured a presentation of the Croatian model of searching for missing persons using state of the art technology of unmanned aerial vehicles and geo radars, and the results of a study on the morbidity and mortality of Croatian war veterans, while the international character of the conference was bestowed by the representatives of the Republic of Kosovo and Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina.

At the conference it was highlighted that the cooperation and links between CSOs from the Homeland War, collaborative and partner relations with the Ministry of Croatian Veterans’ Affairs, and respect for the views of veterans and civil victims of the war represent the foundation for improvement of the quality of life, preservation of memories of the Homeland War, and systematic resolution of issues ensuing from the Homeland War.

A joint coordination meeting was held in October 2021, organised by the National Foundation for Civil Society Development with the representatives of partner organisations involved in all 9 Centres of Knowledge. The meeting, held in hybrid format, featured a presentation of the new four-year period of the National Foundation’s activities for 2022-2025, priority areas and models of CSO engagement in financing in the new multiannual period of using ESI funds (ESF+), and improvements in the implementation of development cooperation for the 2022-2025 period.

The partner organisations of the 9th Centre of Knowledge continued to feed the Knowledge Bases established on their websites with documentation relevant to the transfer of knowledge in the area of activities of the Centres of Knowledge. In 2021, despite the circumstances brought about by the COVID-19 pandemic, the organisations of the 9th Centre of Knowledge managed to organise, implement and participate, live or virtually, in various training sessions, workshops, forums, as well as to influence social development in their area of activity and the public policies in the area of the veteran population and their families.

Call for expression of interest in initial cooperation in the area of cooperation in exchange of knowledge and experience (KEEP)

Guided by the prior good cooperation with other coordinating organisations of the national networks involved in ALF, in 2021 the National Foundation also launched a call for expression of interest in initial cooperation in the area of cooperation in exchange of knowledge and experience titled KEEP (Knowledge and Experience Exchange Programme), through which it was possible to approve grants for exchange of knowledge and experience among CSOs members of the national ALF networks in the form of involvement in educational programmes of IMPACT: Euro-Mediterranean Institution for Adult Education in Philanthropy and Social Development for representatives of CSOs from **42** countries included in the Anna Lindh Foundation.



The call covers cooperation in the training programme organised at IMPACT: Euro-Mediterranean Academy for Philanthropy and Social Development in Zadar, and is focused on representatives of organisations that are members of the national ALF networks, as the final beneficiaries.

Since the main objective of this call is to provide an opportunity to individuals who are (potential or existing) change-makers in their local communities to attend training at the IMPACT Academy in order to improve their knowledge and skills in the field of self-sustainability and quality of life, the selection procedure started with a questionnaire (in English or French) which is prepared so as to provide the applicants with an opportunity to share their opinions/experience in the relevant areas. Then the best candidates are selected, in cooperation with the coordinating organisation of the national ALF network and the National Foundation, and the training programme is initiated, either online or physically, depending on the situation with the epidemiological measures in force at the time.

Digital training was carried out from 25 October to 5 November 2021. However, even though the programme did not fully take root, because of the impossibility of participants being physically present and participating in the work with presenters and mentors according to the planned two-week training cycle, even this form of implementation represents an important contribution to the development of sustainable activities that will contribute in the long run to a better understanding of cultural and political processes in the Euro-Mediterranean, and enhance the activities of individuals and CSOs regarding sustainable development.

HEART PRINT

'DOGOOD PEOPLE' PILOT PROGRAMME - DO GOOD WITH A HEART PRINT

"You don't have to walk on water. You don't need to be better than others.

You have nothing more than anyone else does,

but what makes a difference, are acts which leave in others

Based on the previous cooperation and noteworthy results of awarded and implemented volunteer initiatives by schools receiving in 2017 and 2019 the "Heart Print" award (primary schools) and "Kindness Binds and Unites Us" (secondary schools), in 2021 the National Foundation continued its cooperation with **11** schools and directed them towards new activities of the "DoGood People" pilot programme.

"The world changes through the small habits of many"



Namely, back in 2020 the National Foundation joined the UN initiative "Sustainable Development Solutions Network", and in cooperation with international partners from Sienna and Madrid initiated the development of educational models for primary and secondary schools in line with the **17** sustainable development goals that provide a critical framework for recovery from COVID-19 and contribution to the preservation of the environment. In that regard, as an introduction into training programmes, the National Foundation together with the European Foundation for Philanthropy and Social Development launched the pilot programme of involving children and youth in the 'DoGood People' digital platform in anticipation of the European Philanthropy Day.

'DoGood People' is an international platform applicable to all mobile devices, and within this pilot programme it was adapted to group challenges feasible under school conditions and focused on the attainment of UN sustainable development goals by 2030. The pilot programme is aimed at relaying sustainable habits to children and youth through everyday, easily applicable and simple procedures, and was based on encouraging children and youth to take on group challenges related to sustainable development through the mobile application with the help of their mentors (teachers). The innovative application provided the possibility of promoting specific, simple daily routines for personal and collective contribution to sustainable development, and the schools involved also seized this opportunity to connect among themselves.

Students and teachers of all **11** involved schools participated very actively in the implementation of the 'DoGood People' pilot programme by taking up specific challenges. The following schools were involved:

CROSS-SECTOR AND INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION

Since 2009, the National Foundation has been implementing cross-sector cooperation programmes in the facilities of former military barracks in Zadar, which were renovated into IMPACT – European Centre for Cross-Sector Partnerships. IMPACT carries out its activities with the support of a wide network of partner organisations, trainers, mentors and experts from Croatia, southeast Europe and other countries of the world.

In 2021, IMPACT – European Centre for Cross-Sector Partnerships did not organise seminars, workshops, conferences, round tables, summer schools, public forums or annual assemblies as in the previous years due to the decision of the Civil Protection Headquarters on mobilisation, based on which the accommodation capacities were used for the purposes of self-isolation and quarantine for persons referred to use and be taken care of in the premises of IMPACT centre.

COOPERATION IN THE EURO-MEDITERRANEAN

The Anna Lindh Foundation is dedicated to promoting dialogue among cultures of the Euro-Mediterranean region. The Euro-Mediterranean encompasses the geographic area of Europe, northern Africa and a part of the Middle East, and implies a set of cultural and other contacts and overlaps of the countries lining the Mediterranean Sea. ALF acts as a network of national networks, gathering civil society organisations, public institutions and similar organisation from various areas of activity. Having its seat in Alexandria, Egypt, ALF is present in 42 member countries of the Barcelona Process: Union for the Mediterranean. The aim of ALF is to enable dialogue among cultures and development of sustainable projects and programmes that will contribute to a better understanding of cultural and political processes that shape opinions and behaviours, and improve the activities of institutions and civil society to foster dialogue.

Subsequent to the previous experience of empowering Croatian civil society organisations and focusing on exchange and intercultural dialogue in the Euro-Mediterranean by strengthening and fostering coordination, mobilisation and development, as well by supporting the promotion of ALF and activities, the Croatian Network for Cooperation in the Euro-Mediterranean, coordinated by the National Foundation for Civil Society Development, is facing new challenges as one of the components of the Anna Lindh Euro-Mediterranean Foundation for the Dialogue Between Cultures (ALF).

Having acted for a whole year in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic, which brought about numerous and very dramatic changes in all social spheres, the Croatian network currently has 85 members and is among medium large national networks, managing to retain a large membership despite new circumstances.

During 2021, the National Foundation implemented a project approved in 2020, together with 4 partner organisations – members of the national networks of Greece, Turkey and Spain, titled QUO VADIS EURO-MED CIVIL SOCIETY?. The aim of the project was to analyse the situation in the Euro-Mediterranean, where the civil society has the potential and/or existing practice of operating on the national, regional and international level, thereby also positively and creatively contributing to cross-border cultural relations, with an emphasis on the establishment of the leading role of youth as leaders and change-makers. The expected project outputs included assessment of the current state of affairs of the civil society in the Euro-Mediterranean, recognition and improvement of dialogue and cooperation between various civil society stakeholders in the area, influencing public policies by developing recommendations focused on further development of the civil society, as well as the establishment of a resource base that would include methods, capacity building projects, publications, links to relevant websites etc. The implementation featured several webinars and similar events, including an online survey, of which a detailed report was drafted by the end of the year, and also a video available on the National Foundation's website.

The regular annual meeting of representatives of the Croatian Network was held on 26 April 2021, due to the protection measures against the spread of COVID-19 organised in digital format using the GoToMeeting platform instead of physically. This form of communication and exchange, given the situation with the pandemic, continued over the subsequent months, hence the next meeting of the Croatian Network members in cooperation with the ALF Secretariat was held in the same way, on 30 September 2021, on the subject of analysing the main results of the Intercultural Trends Report in the context of values and challenges in the Euro-Mediterranean, as well as an interactive panel discussion on the results of the ALF Virtual Marathon programme.

In late 2021, Croatia, as one of the **42** countries of the Union for the Mediterranean, got involved in the first celebration of the International Day of the Mediterranean, observed on 28 November, thus spreading the message of the importance of strengthening Mediterranean identity and cooperation between Euro-Mediterranean countries.


As the coordinator of the Croatian Network, the National Foundation for Civil Society Development prepared a short video (available on the National Foundation's website) focused on raising awareness of the importance of activities of all organisations active in the preservation of this area and contributing with their activities to the promotion of dialogue, knowledge and diversity among Euro-Mediterranean cultures by developing tolerance and openness to new insights, religions, cultures and values, as well as to the preservation of natural resources faced with threatening climate change.

PHILANTHROPY AND FOUNDATIONS

In 2021, the National Foundation continued to support the development of philanthropy and foundations through the work of the Croatian Foundations Forum *ZaDobroBIT!*, and additionally through the establishment of development cooperation with the European Foundation for Philanthropy and Social Development, given that the development of foundations in the Republic of Croatia is still lagging behind those in other EU Member States.



The said cooperation encourages further development of philanthropy and foundations, increases recognisability of foundations in the Republic of Croatia, raises the quality of their activities and the culture of giving for public benefit, and promotes social innovations in local communities. The Croatian Foundations Forum *ZaDobroBIT!* gathers **43** foundations registered in various areas of activity.



The membership of the Croatian Foundations Forum *ZaDobroBIT!* was extended in 2021 with five new foundations joining in. The new members joining the Forum in 2021 are:

In 2021, the European Foundation for Philanthropy and Social Development initiated the procedure of including Croatia in the ODOO platform launched by the Transnational Giving Europe (TGE) network which thus provides a practical and safe solution for tax-efficient cross-border donations in money. The TGE network covers 21 countries and enables donors, both corporate and individual residing in one of the participating countries, to support financially non-profit organisations in other member states, directly using the possibility of tax relief provided for in the regulations of their respective countries.


PHILANTHROPY WEEK 2021



This year for the sixth time the Republic of Croatia joined in the celebration of the European Day of Foundations and Donors, observed across Europe on 1 October. The celebration was part of the Philanthropy Week from 1 to 10 October 2021. Due to the epidemiological measures to prevent the spread of COVID-19, the focus was on the virtual format of the implementation of activities which were supported in all major Croatian cities. The main objective of celebrating the European Day of Foundations and Donors was to motivate as many citizens as possible to contribute with their own engagement to further development of philanthropy in Croatia.

The National Foundation for Civil Society Development, in cooperation with the European Foundation for Philanthropy and Social Development as the coordinator of the Croatian Foundations Forum *ZaDobro.BIT!*, renewed the virtual exhibition on the history of philanthropy in Croatia, and also promoted audio-visual material (a short film on philanthropy in Croatia) to motivate citizens to contribute with their own engagement to further development of philanthropy in Croatia.

At the same time, due to the measures employed to prevent the spread of COVID-19, and in the desire to include, as every year, children and youth in the activities, in the week of observing the European Philanthropy Day the National Foundation launched a pilot programme by including **11** schools in the international platform 'DoGood People' through which children and youth were encouraged to take up group challenges programmed with the purpose of attaining the UN sustainable development goals for 2030.



COMMUNITY POTENTIALS

The pilot programme 'Community Potentials' was launched in response to the online survey conducted by the National Foundation and completed by **438** persons from **88** local self-government units from all of Croatia. The survey was completed by key stakeholders making positive changes in the local communities in Croatia, who thus expressed their readiness to join in the new sustainability and resilience models for local communities, and join the training programmes at IMPACT: Euro-Mediterranean Institution for Adult Education. After the implemented educational modules, the National Foundation continues to include new students of educational modules and to provide support for further elaboration of the presented models of local community development with the 1st and 2nd generation of students.



The first training module, focused on training change-makers, was held as a pilot programme from 18 to 29 January 2021 via Zoom and with participation of international professors – experts in socio-economic development and local community development. The first module was followed by the second module focused on coordinating the operationalisation of what has been learned in terms of monitoring, elaboration and presentation of initiatives on the prosperity of the students' local communities.

Along with the director of the National Foundation, Ms Cvjetana Plavša-Matić, lectures and practical exercises were provided by Barry Knight, Crane House (UK), Jenny Hodgson, Global Fund of Community Foundations (South Africa), Edigio Formilan and Elena Badeanschi, *Federazione trentina della cooperazione* (Italy), Gabrielle and Colin Habberton, Relative Group (South Africa) and Joško Brakus, Leeds University Business School (UK).

Following the successful results achieved by the first generation of Academy students, the National Foundation also launched the first training module for the second generation of students (from 25 October to 5 November 2021), who then proceeded to take the second module and operationalise the newly gained insights. Representatives of the Croatian Foundations Forum *ZaDobro.BIT!* also had an opportunity to attend international training on two main topics: "Theory of Change" and "Philanthropy and Social Impact."

Overall, **62** representatives have so far actively participated in the implementation of training programmes within IMPACT: Euro-Mediterranean education academy.




The National Foundation's official website (<https://zaklada.civilnodrustvo.hr>) is a means of informing the general and interested public on the work of the National Foundation, calls for proposals and for expression of interest, call results, announcements of seminars and training programmes of partner organisations, consultations, information on the decisions of the Management Board, reports from conferences and multi-media features, and direct online broadcasts of consultations and meetings organised for the needs of the interested public.

During 2021, the website had a further increase in the number of visits in comparison with the previous year, reaching a monthly average of 62,338 visitors.



Furthermore, in 2021 the National Foundation proceeded with its multi-annual continuity of providing information on the activities of CSOs in the European Union, and on the announcements of calls from the European Social Fund. In addition to providing information on its website, the National Foundation also informs the interested public through e-mailing lists, and by providing professional and technical support to the civilnodrustvo.hr portal.

Information on the work of the National Foundation was shared by various media in **1,032** releases, while an analysis of online and printed media announcements, TV and radio features, showed that **28%** of releases were in the printed media, **71%** in online media, and **1%** in TV and radio features.




In an effort to further increase the number of page views and access more easily the desired information on the website, the redesign of the website provided for customised graphic display on various electronic devices used for communication and Internet access, and in line with the Act on Accessibility a procedure was initiated to adapt all of the National Foundation's digital tools.

INFORMATION

In 2021, the National Foundation continued working on the "Civil Society" portal – an information platform on the activities of CSOs in Croatia. The portal aims to present the multitude and diversity of projects and initiatives of CSOs financed from the public sources, and in particular of projects co-financed by the European Union from the European Social Fund, in order to demonstrate the benefit provided by the implementation of projects to civil society development and the society at large.

Financijske podrške.hr



The website www.financijskepodrske.hr was developed by the National Foundation as a platform which enables CSOs to send e-applications to published calls.

Financijskepodrske.hr (*financijske podrške* = financial grants) is a platform launched in order to connect in one place the grant givers and grant receivers at all stages of grant giving and implementation of approved grants. This way, all information related to the publication of calls, applications, results of the calls, and grant implementation is integrated.

As a platform, [financijskepodrske.hr](http://www.financijskepodrske.hr) not only offers administrative simplifications, but has also reduced large amounts of paper which were used in previous regular applications for the calls. This is an advantage both for the applicants and for the beneficiaries of Potpora_Plus, another online service of the National Foundation, used by those giving grants to CSOs, and directly connected with the use of the application system [Financijskepodrske.hr](http://www.financijskepodrske.hr).

In 2020, successful co-implementation of e-applications for calls launched by state administration bodies was continued.

The National Foundation also achieves efficiency in its activities by continuous investments into computer systems, support and training, both of target programme users and of its own employees.

The National Foundation continued to upgrade Potpora_plus as a unique information system for monitoring financial grants, which was in 2021 used by 8 public administration bodies and/or local and regional self-government units which have established some kind of grant giving for CSO projects and programmes. In 2021, in this way a total of 1,101 applications were received to various calls for which funding was secured from public sources.

In cooperation with and for the purposes of the Croatian Government's Office for Cooperation with NGOs, in 2021 the National Foundation continued to develop the eReportingCSO (elzvještavanjeOCD) module as a website which serves as a single point for the publication of annual reports by levels for all institutions/public administration bodies/local and regional self-government units/companies in full or majority ownership by the Republic of Croatia, which finance CSOs from public sources, and serves to the Office for Cooperation with NGOs as an efficient data retrieval service, as well as for reporting on the financing of CSOs in the Republic of Croatia by the year of financing. During 2021, certain upgrades were made to the system based on the request by the Office for Cooperation with NGOs.

The year 2021 saw the continued use of the interactive reporting module, which received a total of **1,117** reports in digital format.

EUROPEAN SOCIAL FUND - NATIONAL FOUNDATION AS FIB - 2

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Activities of the National Foundation as Intermediate Body Level 2 (IB-2)

On 16 August 2012, the National Foundation for Civil Society Development received the Decision on Accreditation as Intermediate Body Level 2 by the European Commission, for Measure 2 of Priority 5 – Strengthening of the Role of Civil Society Organisations for Socio-Economic Growth and Democratic Development. From accreditation within the IPA IV component to date, the National Foundation has participated in the same capacity in the implementation of the Operational Programme Human Resources Development 2007-2013 for the Priority Axis 5 – Interventions in the field of civil society and in the management and control system for the implementation of the Operational Programme Efficient Human Resources 2014-2020 within the Priority Axis 2 – Social Inclusion, and 4 – Good Governance.

As Intermediate Body Level 2, the National Foundation fulfils all the tasks from within its purview in the preparation of the calls for the submission of project proposals, administrative review of received applications to the calls, review of cost eligibility, in cooperation with Intermediate Bodies Level 1 in the selection of projects, conclusion of grant agreements, and following the contracting, monitoring of project implementation and progress, on-the-spot checks, and checks of the use of visibility elements in all activities of the projects co-financed from the European Social Fund (ESF).

In order to help all interested applicants obtain systematic support in the calls that will be launched within the framework of the European Social Fund (ESF), the National Foundation continues to develop and enhance the Department for Support and Monitoring of EU Programmes which, since November 2019, has been operating as the Department for Support and Information on EU Programmes.

As Intermediate Body, more specifically Intermediate Body Level 2, the National Foundation performs various tasks, cooperates with a large number of other bodies in the management and control system, as well as with many grant beneficiaries. Such a challenging task becomes even more complex and comprehensive in years such as 2021. In 2021, just as in 2020, the world was fighting a pandemic. Therefore, the projects and programmes being implemented need to have even more of an impact on the everyday life and its quality. Namely, the National Foundation is Intermediate Body Level 2 for two priority axis from the European Social Fund – Priority Axis 2 – Social Inclusion, and Priority Axis 4 – Good Governance. Priority Axis 2 – Social Inclusion, inter alia, includes projects focused on fighting poverty and social exclusion, promoting social innovation and experiments, and projects focused on increasing the number and sustainability of social enterprises and their employees. The area of social inclusion, as well as entrepreneurship had to be fostered in the years marked by the pandemic, precisely because they can have an impact on each individual. The National Foundation is also an Intermediate Body Level 2 within the Priority Axis 4 – Good Governance, for programmes focused on strengthening CSO capacities. In difficult situations, such as the pandemic, civil society is well placed to be the first to provide a response, due to its flexibility. Therefore, in order to overcome this year more easily, it was necessary to keep on investing into the development and strengthening of CSO capacities.

Monitoring the implementation of projects financed from the European Social Fund (ESF)

The programming period of the Operational Programme Efficient Human Resources 2014 – 2020 is slowly coming to an end. The projects are going to be implemented until the end of 2023, which is until when incurred costs may be eligible. In that period, the National Foundation for Civil Society Development as Intermediate Body Level 2 can boast excellent results.

In particular, the National Foundation is in the European Social Fund's management and control system, where it executes its delegated authority for participation in the preparation of calls for project proposals, and also participates in the contracting procedure as well as monitors the execution of the grant agreements by beneficiaries, i.e. controls and approves applications for reimbursement.

As Intermediate Body Level 2, in the above programming period from 2014 to 2020, the National Foundation contracted, in cooperation with Intermediate Bodies Level 1 and the Managing Authority, projects in the total value of over **HRK 1,000,000,000.00** through a total of **23** calls for project proposals. Through those **23** calls, **795** projects were contracted, providing a huge contribution to civil society development and strengthening of its capacities, and influencing the social inclusion of final beneficiaries into the community. However, this very successful programming period is nearing its end. In the previous years there was a large number of calls published and grant agreements executed. Thus, the year 2021 saw the conclusion of **247** grant agreements in **5** calls, as follows:

- Strengthening the business of social entrepreneurs – Phase I
- Strengthening the capacities of civil society organisations to promote STEM
- Art and culture online
- Reading for an inclusive society
- Strengthening CSO capacities to respond to the needs of the local community

As previously mentioned, the programming period 2014 – 2020 will soon come to an end. Therefore, the emphasis is increasingly on the successful project implementation and achievement of planned outcomes. The year 2021 was very challenging. With the still raging pandemic and everyday troubles that the whole world was facing, successful implementation of projects and activities put a smile on the beneficiaries' faces every day. In a sea of negativity, daily news of the number of infected and unfortunately large number of those who died, the beneficiaries' participation in a project enabled them to spend time well and focus on their growth and development, thus taking them away from the reality we were living in if only for a little while.

Consequently, below are the expected outcomes that were achieved in 2021, and also those the achievement of which we are expecting over the coming years, all financed from the European Social Fund based on the Operational Programme Efficient Human Resources 2014 – 2020.

The data provided are presented by individual call being implemented in 2021. For every call, the total number of executed grant agreements is provided as well as the large and respectable number of beneficiaries and activities in which they take part.


The overview of planned and executed activities, regardless of whether they entail the participation of the beneficiaries themselves, involvement of volunteers, preparation and publication of scientific studies or something else, demonstrates the diversity of topics and areas covered by the National Foundation through EU financing in its capacity as Intermediate Body Level 2.

The final goal in project implementation is successful approval of funding by the European Commission. Doing this requires successful project implementation. As this is a demanding procedure, one of the venues on which the National Foundation focuses in its work as Intermediate Body Level 2 is beneficiary training. Upon execution of the grant agreement, the National Foundation organises and holds implementation workshops.

Implementation workshops equip beneficiaries with the necessary insights in order to successfully implement their respective activities, achieve the contracted measurable outcomes, and eventually prepare the applications for reimbursement properly. In the period from 2017 up until 2021, the National Foundation carried out 156 workshops with over 2,000 participants. Thus 2021 was also a year in which implementation workshops and semi-annual meetings with the beneficiaries were held. Implementation workshops were held with the beneficiaries, i.e. signatories to the grant agreements in the following calls:

The emphasis of our work in 2021, as in the subsequent years, is on the successful project implementation, i.e. achievement of project outcomes. The role of the National Foundation as Intermediate Body level 2 in the successful achievement of outcomes by beneficiaries is very important.

In 2021, through the implementation support system for beneficiaries of the European Social Fund, the National Foundation as Intermediate Body Level 2 received **12,724** queries. For the sake of a more comprehensive picture of what this means, each of the **12,724** queries requires detailed knowledge of the subject matter, situation in the project itself, and timely provision of the response to the beneficiary.


Furthermore, **1,116** applications for reimbursement were approved during 2021. And in order to successfully approve those **1,116** applications, it was necessary to request from the beneficiaries as many as **1,885** supplementations to the documentation. The beneficiary has to respond to each of those requests for supplementation. On average, it took **7** days per project for the beneficiaries to submit their response.

In order to protect the environment and reduce the consumption of paper, in 2021 the National Foundation as Intermediate Body 2 switched to using digital signatures. Digital signatures also greatly facilitated remote work to which we partially had to transition due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Remote work also continued into 2021, and helped provide a safer workplace for our employees. This contributed to reducing the spread of COVID-19 among our employees vis-à-vis the environment, their families and colleagues.

Thus **6,010** documents were digitally signed in 2021. This figure testifies to the demanding nature and scope of work in the business processes for which the National Foundation has been delegated authority. However, the approved **1,116** applications, **1,885** requests for supplementation and **6,010** digitally signed documents, resulted in the successful approval of **HRK 172,271,317.28**.

Project implementation resulted in a large number of final beneficiaries, i.e. participants of activities related to project implementation.

Each of the contracted projects, in addition to the large number of final beneficiaries, also involves persons who implement the projects and work with the beneficiaries. In successful project implementation, people are usually employed under an employment contract, and were pursuant to this approved the amount of **HRK 69,799,443.91**. However, there is also a considerable number of people receiving their second income by working on the projects, as many as **1,517**, for which funding in the amount of **HRK 16,812,004.93** was approved in 2021.



In 2021, the National Foundation as Intermediate Body Level 2 continued to work on the previously initiated digitalisation of business processes. It is currently in the final stage of developing a software for digital review of applications for reimbursement. Once the software is fully developed, it is expected to accelerate the review and approval of applications, provide a more systematic overview of costs and documents, and reduce the human error factor, both on the side of the beneficiary and on the side of the reviewer.


